# EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS **BEYOND A PANDEMIC RESPONSE**


Planning for both natural and man-made disasters is a priority for the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). On September 8, 2016, CMS published the Emergency Preparedness Requirements for Medicare and Medicaid Participating Providers and Suppliers Final Rule,<sup>1</sup> which became effective November 16, 2016. Healthcare providers and suppliers affected by this rule were to be compliant and implement all regulations by November 15, 2017. The COVID-19 pandemic made it even more evident that emergency preparedness is critically important.

# The Impact of a Crisis

### Planning for Disasters


A crisis can impact access to healthcare services and the healthcare system's ability to respond to the situation. An emergency preparedness plan includes a comprehensive plan to meet health, safety and security needs of the care setting. Emergency plans are critical to protecting the safety of individuals and the larger community and should be comprehensive and individualized to the setting.

#### **Disasters in Oklahoma by Incident Category from May 1953 - February 2023<sup>2</sup>**






