This is a starter list of courses that count towards the one-time DEA 8 hour requirement for training on opioid use disorder or other substance use disorders. According to SAMHSA, "the 8 hours of training can occur through classroom situations, seminars at professional society meetings, virtual platforms, or via other accredited continuing education sources." Furthermore, "the 8 hours do not have to be completed in one session and can be satisfied through cumulative CME hours, as long as the training is provided by or approved by one of the following organizations."
