# BEYOND A PANDEMIC RESPONSE

Planning for both natural and man-made disasters is a priority for the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). On September 8, 2016, CMS published the Emergency Preparedness Requirements for Medicare and Medicaid Participating Providers and Suppliers Final Rule,¹ which became effective November 16, 2016. Healthcare providers and suppliers affected by this rule were to be compliant and implement all regulations by November 15, 2017. The COVID-19 pandemic made it even more evident that emergency preparedness is critically important. With the ending of the Public Health Emergency on May 11, 2023, CMS regulations for Emergency Preparedness (EP) require the provider/supplier to conduct exercises to test their EP plan to ensure that it works and that staff are trained appropriately about their roles and the provider/supplier's processes.




