

Increase in Opioid-related Adverse Drug Events, Including Deaths

The chart below shows the increase in opioid-related Adverse Drug Events, including deaths, for Medicare Fee-for-Service beneficiaries in CO, IA, IL and OK with at least 3 prescriptions of any drug with a 60-day supply and 1 opioid prescription with a 30-day supply AND Medicare beneficiaries with 1 opioid prescription and behavioral health diagnosis.³
