Your 5 Moments for Hand Hygiene



BEFORE TOUCHING A RESIDENT	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands before touching a resident when approaching them. To protect the resident against harmful germs carried on your hands.
BEFORE CLEAN/ ASEPTIC PROCEDURE	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands immediately before performing a clean/aseptic procedure. To protect the resident against harmful germs, including the resident's own, from entering their body.
3 AFTER BODY FLUID EXPOSURE RISK	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands immediately after an exposure risk to body fluids (and after glove removal). To protect yourself and the health-care environment from harmful resident germs.
AFTER TOUCHING A RESIDENT	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands after touching a resident and the immediate surroundings, when leaving the resident's side. To protect yourself and the health-care environment from harmful resident germs.
AFTER TOUCHING RESIDENT	WHEN?	Clean your hands after touching any object or furniture in the resident's immediate surroundings, when leaving - even if the resident has not been touched.
SURROUNDINGS	WHY?	To protect yourself and the health-care environment from harmful resident germs.

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
